The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

The *McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act* is a federal law that provides services to families and unaccompanied youth that live in a temporary situation due to loss of housing.

The term "homeless children and youth":

- 1. Refers to individuals who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence, AND
- 2. Includes children and youth who are:
 - Living in shared housing due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or similar reason.
 - Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, cars, substandard housing, abandoned buildings, and/or campgrounds due to the lack of alternative accommodations.
 - Living in a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designated for or ordinarily used as regular sleeping accommodations for humans.
 - Living in emergency or transitional shelters.
 - Unaccompanied youth (not living with a parent or guardian) living in a temporary situation.
 - Migratory children living in any of the above circumstances.

Parent and Student Educational Rights

- Immediate enrollment in Local Education Agency
- School selection
- Transportation assistance (school bus or VIA)
- Immediate eligibility for free child nutrition

requires state child welfare agencies to work collaboratively with state and local education agencies to promote stability and improve educational outcomes for children in foster care. Students residing in foster care are eligible for all U.S. Department of Agriculture child nutrition programs and caregivers are not required to complete a separate application in order to participate in these programs.
